



Today our Guest Speaker is **Rev. Edward Thompson,** General Presbyter for the Presbytery of West Virginia. Ed was born and raised in New Castle, Pennsylvania. A graduate of the College of William and Mary as well as Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, he served as the pastor of the Mahoning Presbyterian Church in Pulaski, Pennsylvania and the Special Presbyter for Quad 4 of the Presbytery of West Virginia as well as the pastor of the McKinnon Presbyterian Church in Charleston. In June 2007 he became the General Presbyter/Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Northern Kansas and in February 2016 he returned to West Virginia to become the General Presbyter of this presbytery. Ed is married to Jacquelyn Seibert who works in the Children's Department of the Kanawha County Public Library. They have one daughter, Katie, who lives with her husband outside of Boston, Massachusetts as well as a granddaughter, Felicity, who was born on March 2, 2019. Ed's hobbies include running, reading, and watching sports, especially baseball.



This morning we welcome to our worship service Guest Musician, **N. David Stern,** who is a retired West Virginia music teacher with 52 years of experience (47 years at South Charleston High School). He has many years of experiencing working with church music. He is currently the organist/pianist/choir director of Temple Israel in Charleston, starting in September 1964; Organist/choir director, Trinity United Methodist, starting fall, 1959, moving directly to Humphreys United Methodist (name changed to West Side United Methodist, then to the current name Canaan United Methodist), retiring after 44 years, first as organist/pianist, then moving to choir director, then to choir director/organist. After one week of "vacation" he moved to Bream Presbyterian for 11 years, (first as their organist/pianist, then later filling in as choir director/pianist/ organist for the last few years). He retired on May 31, 2021.
